NAICS summary:

This Canadian industry comprises establishments primarily engaged in providing non-residential social assistance services to improve the quality of life for the elderly, persons with developmental disabilities or persons with disabilities. These establishments provide for the welfare of these individuals in such areas as day-care, non-medical home care, social activities, group support and companionship.

Included examples:

- activity centres, elderly or persons with disabilities*
- adult day-care centres*
- care attendant service for persons with disabilities
- day care centres, adult and persons with disabilities*
- family care, home-maker services
- home care of elderly
- home maintenance, home-maker services
- home-maker services
- household care, home-maker services
- non-medical home care for persons with developmental disabilities
- red cross, homemaker service
- respite worker services, without nursing skills
- senior citizen centres*
- senior citizens associations*
- social services, home-maker

Exclusions:

- job training for persons with disabilities and persons with developmental disabilities (See 624310 Vocational rehabilitation services)
